Committee Reports—Delegate Report, George Sikes

September Delegates Meeting

I attended the Delegate meetings in Newark, New Jersey, September 12, 2011 and September 13, 2011.

At the Parent Club Committee meeting, Monday, September 12, 2011, a plan was brought before the committee to enhance the Parent Clubs. It would be called "PARENT CLUB OF EXCELLENCE." It would be similar to "Breeder of Merit." A club would receive points for increasing membership, judges education, health, rescue, junior handlers, conformation, etc. If a club receives X number of points, the club will become a "Club of Excellence." There will be a lot of paper work. The question was asked if this would be done on a yearly basis, and no answer was given. A three member committee was formed to put this plan together.

There was a long discussion in the Parent Club meeting on the decision of the Board to eliminate AKC staff attendance at delegate committee meetings.

The proposal of a reserve winner at National Specialties receiving a three point major, if the winner receives a five point major, will go before the Board again.

There was an announcement in Delegate Caucus meeting that group realignment is back. If you like 10 groups, you will love 11. Sporting would be divided into two groups; hound into two groups, working into three groups, Terrier would be group eight, Toys group 9, Non-Sporting group 10, and herding group 11.

All Parent Club Committee Members were reelected to the Committee. For other Committees, you may visit AKC Delegate Committees on the AKC website.

The AKC Gazette is now online in PDF or digital format. You may find it on the "AKC Magazines" webpage. This page will also provide links to an archive of past issues. A link to the new issue will also be attached to the AKC Weekly Winners Gallery email once a month. The Gazette is free to all and will be available the first Friday of each month.

The December Delegates meetings will be held December 15, 2011 and December 16, 2011, in conjunction with the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship in Orlando FI.

Tickets to the AKC/Eukanuba National Championship in Orlando are now on sale online.

Committee Reports—Rescue, Lynn Ramich

I keep telling people that rescue has changed significantly since I started in 1994. The biggest changes have been vetting costs and the internet. The internet made rescue easier to find adopters but it also made it easier to turn dogs into rescue. Petfinder has been a godsend. 90% of our dogs are placed through Petfinder.

At one time, Bichons were the top three dogs being produced by puppymills. There were times when we were overwhelmed with Bichons but they were younger and, for the most part, reasonably healthy. Bichons are no longer the big money maker for the millers and with state laws making it harder for the millers. We are seeing fewer Bichons in rescue. The changes we are seeing today are due to the economy. Though less Bichons are coming into rescue, we are asked to take in more older dogs and dogs with health issues because people can no longer afford the cost and care of these high maintenance dogs. We are not alone. Talk to any breed rescue and they will tell you the same story. We are getting fewer applications, so the dogs are staying in rescue longer, which adds to our expenses.

The other big change we are seeing are the designer dogs. I can remember watching the Petfinder counts and a high week of listed Bichons was 400 in rescue. Now we are seeing 800-1000 but the majority of them are Bichon mixes. Up to now, we have been saying no to the mixes. There have been a few cases that we said yes. If my Facebook followers remember Teddy (shih-tzu-bichon) his owner had cancer and I couldn't say no. He was also biting his owner and because she never corrected him. Teddy became my nemesis. I won't get into that here, suffice to say that Teddy is happy in Texas and I'm even happier. Right now, we have few dogs in rescue. There may be times when we have to take in a Bichon mix. We aren't going to make a habit of it but sometimes, you cannot say no. We have a special program for placing senior dogs with seniors for \$75. This is to encourage seniors to adopt the older dogs. The designer dogs are younger and we would get a larger adoption donation for them.

We want to thank Barbara Chappell and Companion Pet Retreat, Inc. for a very generous donation of \$10,000. We cannot survive without generous people like this.

To be eligible for a Register of Merit (ROM) Award, the subject dog is to have been: the Sire of seven (7) or more, or the Dam of five (5) or more, Champions of Record. To be eligible for a Register of Merit Excellent (ROMX) Award, the subject dog is to have been: the Sire of twenty-five (25) or more, or the Dam of ten (10) or more, Champions of Record. The progeny are to be Champions of Record, confirmed by AKC.

How to apply for your award:

To apply for your ROM/ROMX please submit the following two documents:

- 1. An AKC Progeny Report for the sire or dam, listing the Champions of Record avail able from the AKC On-Line Store for \$25.00; OR publications from AKC Ga zette, AKC Awards, BFCA Banquet Awards Booklets or Bichon Reporters verify ing the Champions of Record.
- 2. Copy of current AKC registration, showing all owners of the sire or dam

<u>Note:</u> If you are unable or unsure about obtaining the AKC Progeny Report, then you may submit your request with a copy of the current AKC registration and a non-refundable check for \$25.00. I will obtain the AKC Progeny Report and mail a copy to you.
